TULIP TIME FESTIVAL



Historical Village and Vermeer Windmill Tour

507 Franklin Street, purchase tickets at north gate off Franklin Street

The Historical Village and Vermeer Windmill ticket includes a tour of the Vermeer Windmill (including the grinding and observation level) as well as the Wyatt Earp Boyhood Home, the Werkplaats, Beason-Blommers Grist Mill, Dutch Bakery, gift shop, and more than 45,000 tulips planted throughout the Village. The Wyatt Earp Experience takes you on a journey through the life of the famous Western lawman in his childhood home. Craft demonstrations throughout the day include woodworking, rope making, knitting, Hindeloopen painting, quilting, wooden shoe production, rug braiding, and Dutch letter baking.

When you visit the Vermeer Windmill, you'll tour five floors, from the base of the mill where grain would have been brought in, to the top floor where grain is milled. It's one of the tallest working windmills in North America! Please note that not all levels are handicap accessible.

Tulips

Tulip Avenue in Central Park and Sunken Gardens Park

The City of Pella plants tens of thousands of tulips throughout these two parks in celebration of Pella's Dutch heritage. Especially vibrant and colorful is the Tulip Avenue in Central Park, which runs from the north fountain to the center of the park. An immense variety of tulips are showcased along this sidewalk.

Scholte House Gardens

Corner of Broadway and Washington Streets

Behind the Historic Scholte House Museum are the beautiful Scholte Gardens. Featuring more than 35,000 tulips, the gardens are free and open to the public. At one time, this land was under the care of Maria Scholte, the wife of Pella's founder Dominie Hendrik P. Scholte. Here you'll find benches to rest on, art sculptures to admire, a gazebo for shade, and many varieties of tulips. Once the tulips have finished blooming, they are replaced with annuals so that the garden remains enjoyable through autumn.

Fair Haven Memorial Garden

Corner of East 3rd and Union Streets

This popular garden was originally planted in 1947 with tulip bulbs donated by the Netherlands in gratitude for war-relief aid sent by the citizens of Pella after World War II. Today these gardens feature more than 13,000 tulips. The Memorial Garden also features two monuments listing more than 800 local veterans who served in WWII. Once the tulips have finished blooming, they are replaced with annuals so that the garden remains enjoyable through autumn.

Central College

812 University Street

Nearly 15,000 tulips will bloom on Central College's beautiful campus. The main tulip beds are located in the plaza by Graham Conference Center, east and north sides of Central Hall, Jordan Plaza, Peace Mall, and Weller Flag Garden, with various other small beds and at the campus cornerstones. Approximately 30 different varieties will bloom throughout the spring.

Fresh Tulip and Bulb Sales

Purchase fresh-cut tulips that are specially designed and packaged by local farmer Meredith Nunnikhoven of Barnswallow Flowers, or add color to your garden by purchasing a collection of bulbs shipped to your front door. Learn from regional farmers and gardeners about growing tulips in the Midwest, and enjoy an amazing live art installation with tulips. A portion of each sale is donated to Pella Historical Museums and Tulip Time.

Entertainment and Performances

Tulip Toren, Franklin Street

Our afternoon and evening shows take place on the Tulip Toren stage. Tickets may be purchased outside the Grandstand area. The afternoon Grandstand shows begin at 1 pm each day and end with our Volks parade. The show features Dutch dancing and singing, Dutch Costume Culture Show, presentation of the Tulip Queen and her Court and more.

Our FREE evening Feesthouden shows feature special entertainment each night (7 pm on Thursday and Friday, 6:30 pm on Saturday) on the Tulip Toren stage. Special thanks to Central College for sponsoring these evening shows! In 2024, our entertainment will feature:

Thursday Evening

Bridges 2 Harmony Gospel Choir

The Bridges 2 Harmony Gospel Choir (B2H) was formed to give students at Roosevelt High School in Des Moines, Iowa, a high-quality musical experience in the gospel genre. The 52-member choir has become known for its passionate and rich choral vocals, "precision, discipline, respect and perfect tenderness."

Friday Evening

Pella Community High School Jazz I

Pella Jazz I is directed by Jeff Robilliard and consists of students from Pella Community High School. They will play a range of music including classics by Duke Ellington and Shorty Rogers as well as more contemporary tunes by Iowa composers such as Michael Conrad and Steve Shanley.

Fireworks! A special treat after the parade on Friday is the fireworks display. Sponsored by Pella Corporation, this fireworks show is visible from the downtown area.

Saturday Evening

Jason Brown

Country music recording artist Jason Brown has performed for hundreds of thousands of music fans across the Midwest. Brown has charted 5 songs consistently on the Billboard and MediaBase Country Charts. He was born in the heart of the Midwest, three miles outside of Pella, Iowa, from a bloodline of truck drivers, coal miners and farmers. Gospel and traditional country songs are some of his favorites.

Parades

We have two parades each day of the festival. The afternoon Volks parade at approximately 2:45 pm brings Dutch culture and Pella fun to life. Or, view the parade in a special way at the evening lighted parade at approximately 8:30 pm Both parades follow the conclusion of the grandstand shows on the Tulip Toren. See map for parade route.

Klokkenspel

Pella's Klokkenspel brings the Old World to Pella in a musical way! Enjoy the 147-bell carillon as you watch figures tell of Pella's history and heritage. Performance times are every 30 minutes each day of Tulip Time.

Pella Opera House

Relax while enjoying a show at the Pella Opera House – a beautiful historic theater in the heart of downtown. You'll find a Martini Huis and shows for all ages throughout the festival including The Reluctant Pioneer – the story of Maria Scholte, Matt Barber Experience, Tiptoe Through the Tulips with Davis Folkerts on the Barton Theatre Organ and Jara Johnson. Tickets are available for unlimited access to the Great Hall and Historic Pella Photo display as well as the restrooms. Please see schedule for performance times.

Local Performers

Check out our schedule for performances throughout the three days of Tulip Time.

Dutch Family Singers: Listen and watch Dutch songs and traditional dances performed by an energetic group of families in Dutch costume.

Dutchesses: A group of high school women sing traditional Dutch songs and perform Dutch dances in Dutch costume, complete with wooden shoes!

Tiny Tulips: Students in grades 4th through 6th perform classic songs in Dutch such as "Happy Birthday" and "Are You Sleeping?"

Local "Celebrities:" The Tulip Queen and her Royal Courtt, Sinterklaas, and famous western lawman Wyatt Earp.

Pella High School Orchestra Strolling Strings (Thursday & Friday only): Members of the Pella Community High School Orchestra perform Dutch songs and classical music on violin, viola, cello and bass. Weather permitting.

Museums

Along with the Vermeer Windmill and Historical Village, explore the Scholte House Museum, stroll around the Tuttle Cabin, and learn from the Fire House Museum, Pella Rolscreen Depot Museum, Vermeer Corporation Museum and Veterans Museum.

Third Church will have nursing and changing areas, along with wheelchairs and first aid tent, all located on the west side of Central Park. Refreshments will be available.



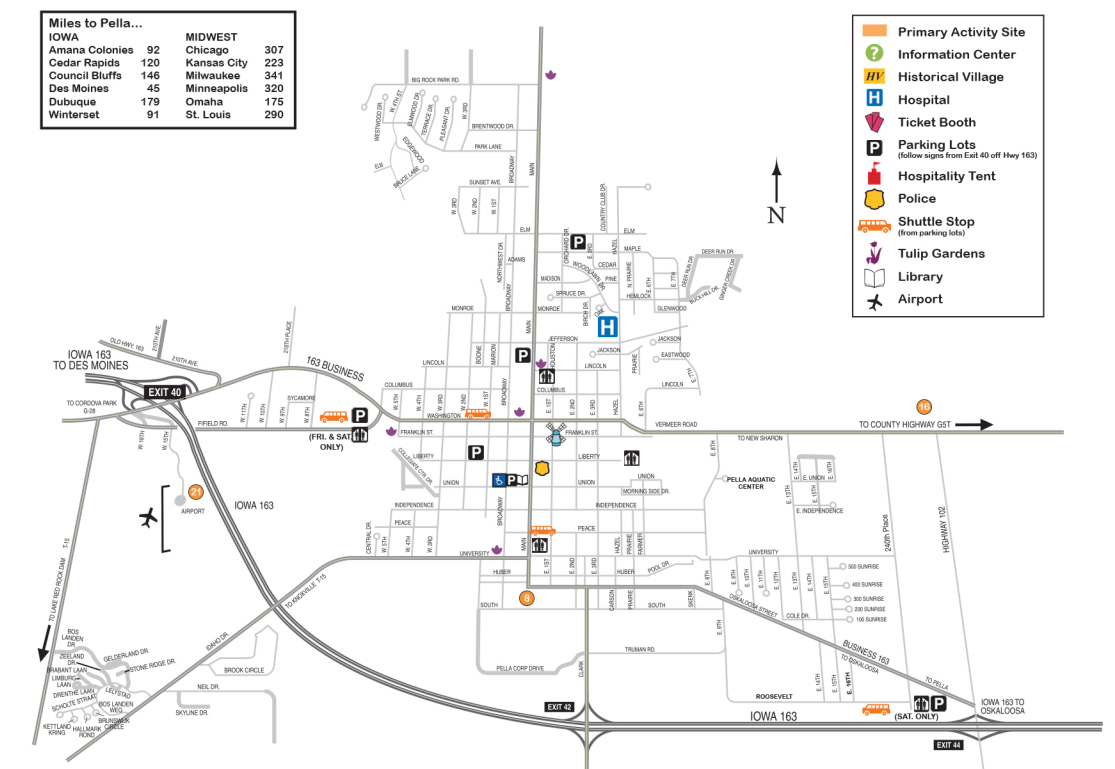
